CNIB is committed to providing the Provincial Capital Commission and your Board with regular updates on the status of our redevelopment project.

Further to your letter dated January 28, 2020 reinstating the CNIB Redevelopment Project at Stage 23 of the 38 Stage process. CNIB has acted on the stipulation regarding additional communications with the following, since our August 12, 2020 update:

- CNIB continues to update our [www.cnibinthepark.ca](http://www.cnibinthepark.ca) website with updates on the project.
- CNIB responds to all emails received at the [inthepark@cnib.ca](mailto:inthepark@cnib.ca) email.
- Once there is movement on the project again, we will continue to post updates on CNIB's social media accounts.

CNIB is committed to enhancing accessibility in Wascana Park, in May, we announced our Wascana Park Accessibility Project. CNIB set up more than 230 GPS points around the main walking path in Wascana Park that speak to BlindSquare to help individuals with sight loss to navigate independently. As well, the organization approached business in and around the park to install beacons. Seven business and public amenities in and around Wascana Park now have this technology - The Royal Saskatchewan Museum, The Saskatchewan Science Centre and The MacKenzie Art Gallery are the latest three equipped with this technology since our last report.
